

NORTH SUMATRA

Indonesia is well known as a country with many lands for adventure as well as its unforgettable panoramic views. Some of the lands are found in North Sumatra Province, the gate western of tourist main destinations in Indonesia. The province lies in the northern part of Sumatra Island, the second largest island from 17,054 islands in Indonesian archipelago and the closest to the continental part of Asia both geographically and historically.

North Sumatra Province lies between two oceans, the Indonesian Ocean in the west and Malacca Strait sea in the east.

Surrounded by rich tropical natural resources, North Sumatra offers spectacular panoramas of rugged terrains in the mountainous range of Bukit Barisan, beautiful paddy fields, colorful coral reefs, and comfortable holiday resorts.

Close to Malaysia and Singapore, this province happens to be the most popular tourist destination. North Sumatra Province is continuously developing to be an alternative sport tourist destination, such as Arung Jeram (White water rafting), Kayak Arus Deras (swift current kayak), Surfing, Mountain Bicycling, Diving and others.

The North Sumatra Province covers an area of approximately 71,800 squared kilometers, comprising of fertile low land areas in the eastern part covered with mangrove along its coast and high mountainous areas that occupy about two thirds of the province in which lies the largest lake formed through magnificent volcano eruption: the Lake Toba. THE TESTICLE TESTERS

On the 9th June 2007 around 90 hashers, from various Medan chapters, put their bodies on the line for the sake of Pan Asia Hash 2007. This was the day that the proposed ball breaker run was put to the test.

The group met at 10:00am in the Fleet Pub to register for the run and it was good to note that coffees were the drink of choice not Bintang. The registration procedure also gave the Pan Asia Hash Cash the opportunity to test his state of the art bar code system. Pretty appropriate that he was doing it in a bar. By about 10:45 everybody was signed up and had boarded the buses that were to take us to the run start point. The weather looked good for running. Slightly overcast, thus providing protection from the big current bun in the sky.

A one hour fifteen minute ride towards the Bukit Barisan Mountains and Berastagi took us to the appointed location in Sibolangit. With everyone eager to get on the trail the hash flashes had a little difficulty delaying the mob for the obligatory photographs. But we have them on film as the accompanying picture shows.

The start of the run made me think of the book and film, the 39 steps. But in this case it was more like 390 steps that we had to negotiate from our photographic mountain perch to the valley below. The views were great and I still had the energy to enjoy them. It was easy running along the course of the water pipeline, originally installed by the Dutch, and still supplying Medan's needs. But of course all good things come to an end and the first false trail saw us making a right turn and heading upwards again onto a narrow ridge for more great views as you paused to get your breath. What goes up unfortunately must eventually go down, and so we did. Across a swift flowing stream and then it was up again but luckily not quite as extreme as the first climb. Then came an opportunity for the runners to again stretch their legs with a long steadily downhill run to a bridge over the river and a short section of tarmac before it was back into the jungle again. After a second river crossing it was again steady downhill running to the first water stop.

The FRB reached the water stop in one hour and twenty five minutes with yours truly clocking in just on the two hours. This had been a really great section with everything that Medan hashing has to offer. As I like to take my pleasure in short memorable bursts I opted to join the support team at the first water stop and allowed the real testicle testers to continue on their masochistic way. After around another two hours of fairly amenable running the FRB reached the end of the run. The on site medical team immediately examined his balls and pronounced them intact. Runners: 1; Ball breaker: 0! The final runners came in, in around five hours or so looking a little less fresh than the FRB. The medical team reported that although some balls were slightly bruised and perhaps even oval in shape none could be pronounced broken. Hence the contest between runners and the run was honours even, and it was into round two. The down-down circle and drinkers vs. Bintang.

This was always going to be odds on result, and sure enough Bintang again came out on top. The FRDs (front running drinkers) did try their best to stay the course but the barrels were bigger than they were. Thus the GM had an almost endless supply of cold ones, which were to prove too much for even this mob of hardened down-downers.

The run was declared to be good, with the first section reaching the excellent standard. More work will be done on the second and third stages of the run so when you Pan Asia Testicle Testers try your luck your balls may indeed be broken! Whatever the state of your appendage after the run we hope that when you reflect on the run you will agree with us when we make the claim that, "Medan has some of the best, if not the best, hashing terrain in the world."

ABOUT THE RUNS

No this is not where you find out how to cure the shits! The following is a brief outline of what you should expect from the various runs we have set at Pan Asia 2007.

There will be the usual ball breaker run together with two long, five medium and three short runs.

When we say long/medium/short we are referring to the time it will take to complete the run not the distance. The type of terrain crossed can have as much influence on the duration of a run as the distance covered.

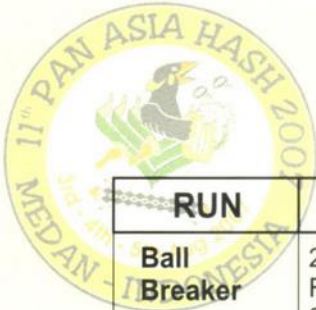
All but one of the runs will be A B.

There will of course be checks and false trails on the runs. A check will be marked with a circle. The continuing trail can be anywhere within 360 degrees and it may be 100 200 metres before new paper starts. Similarly false trails may be 100 200 metres long but will eventually reach a bar mark. A simple rule is that if you haven't seen any paper for 200 metres you are off trail! Please note that the sweeper hares cannot find you if you are "off trail."

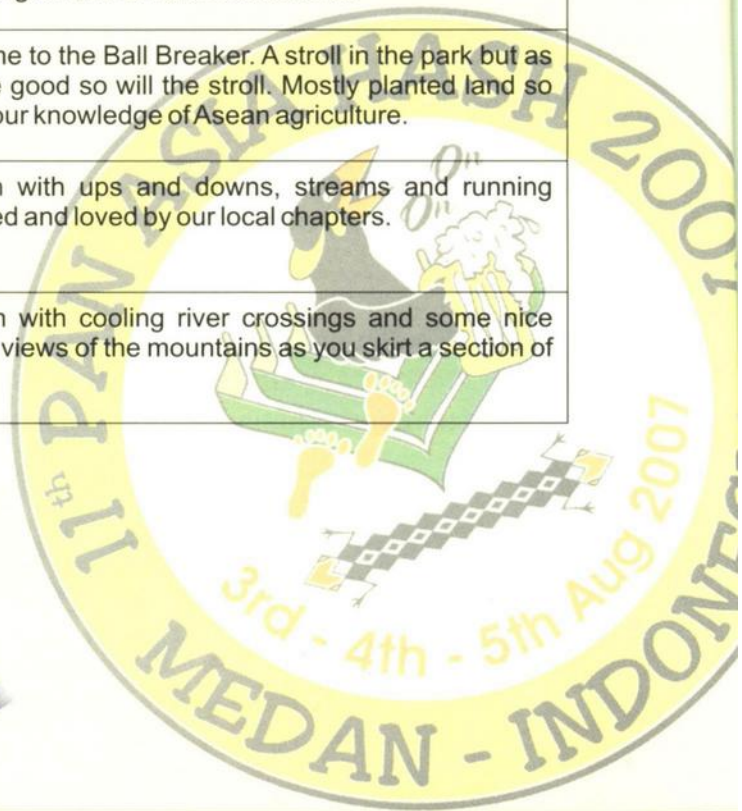
All the runs are in the foothills of the Bukit Barisan Mountains between 19 and 40 kilometers from Medan. This is the area that the Medan Hash chapters frequently use for their runs. The area is a mixture of forest and planted land, the latter featuring areas of palm oil and rubber plantation, rice fields and various other crops.

Numerous shallow rivers and streams run through the valleys which lead down from the mountain plateaus before Berastagi. You will find yourself running along and across these valleys and along the ridges which flank them. The trails may at times be narrow but there should be ample opportunity for the runners to stretch their legs. The river crossings will help cool you down and clean you off. All the rivers can be easily waded and no swimming is required. Most of the runs have plenty of tree cover to shade you from the sun.

It is said that "variety is the spice of life," so we have tried to give you that in the runs we have set. Expect all of the following: flatter running sections but also hill climbs; clear streams and muddy pools; planted land and jungle; firm clear trails and equally rougher terrain.



RUN	LENGTH	DESCRIPTION
Ball Breaker	21.6 km FRB in in 3hr 25 mins	Spectacular view at the start so make the best of it. Great terrain with all you want from a hash. Running climbing, wading, wallowing and testicle testing.
Long 1	9.7 km FRB in in 1hr 35 mins	Great views of the mountains if clear. Start through mixed terrain then steady running through a new palm oil plantation. Shady trails and two cool river crossings to finish a good run.
Long 2	10.2 km FRB in in 1hr 50 mins	This run goes roughly east-west so keep the sun in your eyes and you should be all right. It has a little bit of everything and is the longer of the two long runs.
Medium 1	7.4 km FRB in in 1hr 25 mins	Narrow ridge to begin with then some really nice trails with a couple of cooling stream crossings. Overall you loose elevation but have to do the usual up and down in between. Well worth the effort.
Medium 2	7.2 km FRB in in 1hr 20 mins	River crossings, ridges, ups and downs, local colour. The horse shoe ridge section is god sent when you look at what is in between. A great mixed bag.
Medium 3	6.7km and FRB in in 1hr 15 mins	Progressively but not oppressively uphill. New palm oil at the beginning but then mixed country. One of the few river crossings where the hares were nice enough to find a bridge. A nice medium run.
Medium 4	6.7 km and FRB in in 1hr 15 mins	Well hashed terrain because it's good stuff. River crossings with and without bridges. Good running section but you will have to pay your penance with a bit of up and down. Value for money.
Medium 5	6.3 km and FRB in in 1hr 20 minutes	Good for the trekies at the start but then the runners come into their own with a really good ridge section. Last part is mixed with a nice amble down a shallow stream bed before a bit of up and down and in! The only A-A run. Again one to be recommended
Short 1	4.6 km and FRB in in 1hr	The opposite extreme to the Ball Breaker. A stroll in the park but as the company will be good so will the stroll. Mostly planted land so you can check out your knowledge of Asean agriculture.
Short 2	5.7 km and FRB in in 50 minutes	Good mixed terrain with ups and downs, streams and running sections. Well hashed and loved by our local chapters.
Short 3	5.5 km and FRBs in in 55 minutes	A very pleasant run with cooling river crossings and some nice running trails. Good views of the mountains as you skirt a section of rice fields.

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"BANDA ACEH H3 BEATS THE TSUNAMI"

Just about everyone in the world now knows what a Tsunami is after the devastating example of this natural phenomena that hit South East on the 26th December, 2005. But how many of you know that Banda Aceh, which bore the brunt of the Tsunami's devastation, is also the home to Indonesia's most northerly hash house harrier chapter? Probably not too many, so read on and be enlightened.

It was a scene I had witnessed many times before, but this one was slightly different and I knew it.

The Banda Aceh hash had not run for nearly six years and this mainly due to a conflict that turned into an ugly war between the Free Aceh Movement (GAM) and the Indonesian government in Jakarta. It was in July 1999 that we last ran the weekly hash and that time it was on the nearby island of Sabang, a ferry ride from Banda Aceh that cost about one US dollar, although a year or so previously the boat had sunk and with it went about 200 lives. It is ironic that in Indonesia everything seems to be cheap including human lives. But that change of venue was only putting off the inevitable as the Acehnese hills were alive with rebels of all kinds in a conflict that was purposely confusing and violent. There was always hope for peace which had come and gone before, but then on December 26th 2004 Mother Nature decided to send Aceh a 20 metre high tsunami wave which broke the back of the province, let alone taking the lives of nearly 200,000 people. Just prior to that disaster we had talked of doing a hash how cruel life can be.

But the scene I talk about today was a convey of cars carrying hashers to the return run of BAH3 and apprehensive we all were.

Dimples and Sharkfin (surviving hashers) and now the new GM's (joint responsibility) stood with me and shared the obvious delight. One of the noticeable differences were the cars themselves, modern four-wheel drives belonging to NGO's, the World Bank and ADB etc and not the clapped-out hardtops of six years ago, but nonetheless a wonderful scene and the vehicles carrying many laptop virgins who had never hashed before.

We hoped to get 40 runners but in fact there were over 80 and they came in all shapes and sizes.

About three weeks prior to this I had travelled to Aceh to form a new committee and was more than surprised to find twelve old hash faces sitting round the table for the first meeting. We had lost everything to the wave, hash equipment, hash records, photographs (hash memories) and goodness knows how many old hashers had sadly lost their lives in this horrendous disaster. And so with a shoestring budget we formed the new committee and decided to continue the run number from before. Run number 868, the return of BAH3, March 25th 2006.

No matter where you go in the world it seems you will find hashers, and so it was in Aceh with a number of NGO's and other organizations all fronting up people with a

little hashing background. Thankfully the Aussies came to our rescue courtesy of Carno-Acil (real name Jack Williams) who conjured up 100 special t-shirts, and then there was ex Banda Aceh hasher Bigtoe who sent a magnificent blaster horn and plastic hash shit

from England. As the news began to spread, so people sent us old photos and many words of encouragement memories of hashers that had been in Aceh 20 years ago or more.

Then there was Piglet who was on 99 runs a mere 15 years ago and now running today to get his 100 run t-shirt Ooops slight mismanagement, but please we need just a little more time. It took him 32 months from 1988 to 1991 to reach 99 runs and then..... well as you know it's a long story.

Thankfully the laptop virgins survived despite a few seriously wandering off paper, and then Quennie, a long time hasher (but not for a while) had seriously forgotten the hash song which is why he was selected as hash music in the first place mind you; he was far from alone in this respect.

For those that don't know about Aceh province perhaps I should mention that there is no beer on the hash these days, and this will be hard (in fact almost impossible) for many hashers to absorb let alone understand. My last six years put me in Medan, and those that have hashed in this part of North Sumatra will know that beer is a serious part of hashing and I do believe some of the songs have slightly different words then they are sung in Aceh! But here we are in Aceh and at long last the hash is back up and running. There are of course many sad stories that could be told, but now is a time to look forward and to hope that the province will remain at peace and that the hash will not only continue, but will also grow in popularity especially with the influx of so many aid organizations.

On an ending note, I would like to thank a number of people. Firstly to the Wolf, a young German hasher (well not quite as young as he was) who took the time and the trouble to fly all the way out here and in doing so donated a considerable amount of money to support the hashing widows of Lhoknga ON ON Wolf who was more than keen to see the BAH3 back up and running again and thank you also to all the contributors from Germany. Then our sincere thanks go to the Cambodian hashers who also made a donation to support amputee victims of the Tsunami. Medan hashers also made donations to a number of the Tsunami relief efforts. All told the hash contributions approached \$20,000. Perhaps not much in the big picture but not bad from a supposedly disorganised bunch of beer drinking reprobates.

Finally a big thank you to the surviving Indonesian hashers for not only their support and friendship, but also for their determination to bring back an old custom to Aceh which I hope will be ON ON towards a new and better future for the Acehnese people and the region.

A HISTORY OF MEDAN'S FIRST HASH CHAPTER

If there was life in Medan before 1973 it must have been pretty dull and boring. However in August of that year things were to change. It was then that a small group of expatriates and locals met to form the Medan Hash House Harriers and to forever change Monday night expectations for those who were to follow in their footsteps. Amongst the founding fathers were such as Nick "The Gent" Grant, "Steamboat" Singh, Jim "Barefoot" Palmer, Rudy "Lagger" Lie and of course the very first Grand Master, Lindsey "Digger Too" Few. Nick was the only one who had previous hashing experience and had hashed in Jakarta, so Medan must grudgingly accept that they trace their hashing line back to Mother Hash in KL through the Jakarta Monday hash. This obligation was repaid many years late when ex Medan hashers Wombat and Geronimo formed the Batavia Hash in Jakarta so as to be able to continue their Medan traditions, chief amongst which was the dinking of draught Bintang as opposed to the other unmentionable variety the Monday Jakarta mob drink.

In those early days however draught beer of any form hadn't appeared on the Medan scene and the main challenge for the thirsty hasher was simply to get a "cold" one. This problem was answered when the Swan Pub was opened exclusively for hashers and friends. This establishment was run by Parmi Baath who has unfortunately since passed away having spent the last few years of his life running a small hotel on SAMOSIR Island. It was from the Swan that the whole hash would leave in an assortment of landrovers carrying all the beer they needed for the after the event refreshments. Trips were generally pretty short as it was easy to find good hashing country within ten kilometers of the centre of Medan in those days. Runs were also pretty short as these early hashers were purist who knew that the hash is a drinking club that runs and not the reverse.

I don't know when the Running Bottle became the hash logo but it was an inspired choice as it fits exactly the ethos of what hash should be all about. As to the phrase that accompanies the bottle, "Give us your tired weak and weary and we will completely destroy them." Well this will mean more to you if you have run a Medan trail and participated in a down-down circle.. If the hills don't get you the beer will! These days Medan hashers boast of "walking on water and running on Bintang" and as you are almost always guaranteed at least one river crossing and definitely guaranteed as much Bintang as you can drink this is no idle boast.

It is Medan tradition to change the GM and committee on a yearly basis both because the strain on GM's liver is generally too much to stand for more than one year and also because the Medan mob can only stand one year of any GM's bullshit. Thus to date you might expect we would have had thirty two GMs. However the tally actually stands at 26. This is explained by the fact that while some GMs did not complete their full year due to their misplaced priorities of putting work before hash there have been other either power crazy or simply stupid GMs who have served for more than the one year. Having known or met all but one of the GMs I can attest that there is ample evidence of strained livers, bullshitting, megalomania and stupidity amongst this group of Medan's finest. I believe all but one of our GMs is still able to down the occasional beer

if not be a front running bastard. Unfortunately one of the founder members and the third GM, Jim "Barefoot" Palmer died in a plane crash in Jakarta some years ago.

As I mentioned the Medan hash committee is changed every year and it was in 1980 that the GM Gary "Washpeg" Hadfield inaugurated the now obligatory hare chase "Erection" run where the outgoing GM and some of his committee are live hares. Of course if a hare is caught on this run he must be stripped. Amongst those who have had the distinction of appearing as the nude hasher of the year was "Swing Low" another of our very early, if not a founder, hashers. Following the run the new committee is "Erected." As you may have assessed this is no mere spelling mistake. Medan Hash has never dabbled with democracy or free choice thus neither are the hashing population consulted on the make up of the new committee nor are the new members asked if they wish to serve. Cometh the hour, cometh the men, like it or like it not! Also as many of our hashers are of chinese origin, an L often rolls of their tongue more easily as an R and anyway no matter what your political persuasion I am sure you would prefer an "Erection" to an "Election."

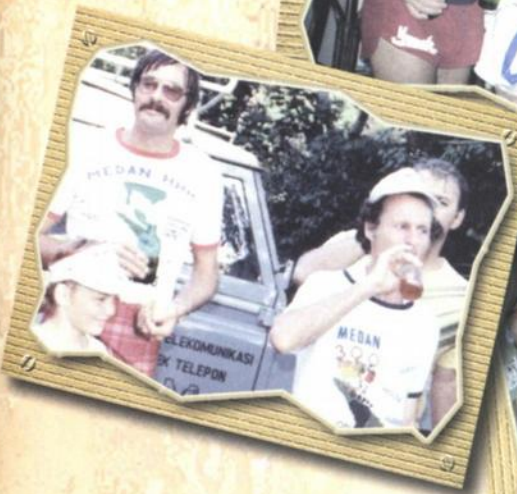
Amongst our 26 Gms have been Aussies, Kiwis, Yanks, Brits and now finally Gms from the local community here in Medan. As the Medan Hash has progressed from a group that was initially comprised of over 90% expatriates to one which is now well over 90% local hashers this should be no great surprise but an expectation. Whatever the nationality Gms have continued to uphold the traditions of the Medan hash while changing with the times where this has become necessary. Thus while our down-down circles are now conducted in a mixture of English and Indonesian, a short cutting bastards is still a short cutting bastard and is punished accordingly.

Over the years there have been many "highs" for Medan hash and I will just mention one or two of the top liners. In 2003 Medan hash celebrated its 30 year anniversary in Lake Toba. This run followed a long tradition of Lake Toba runs which all started with the 200th run expertly organized by the sadly missed "Barefoot." I am reliably informed that absolutely everything was free. But of course those were the years when oil was king in Medan. We are now rapidly approaching our 2000th run and if this is anything as good as our 1000th run it will be a cracker. What I remember most about this run was the marathon down-down circle conducted mostly in pouring rain. Amongst the crowd were kilted hashers from Aberdeen including ex Medan man "Farmer" who left the crowd in no doubt what a Scotsman wears under his kilt. Ex GM "Dubai" was back from Phuket as were Wombat, Sheepskin, MGM and Leaky Dick all now with Batavia. What the final down-down count was I am sure no one remembers but it very well may have been a Medan record.

This has been a very brief resume of the Medan Hash and there is much more to tell, so if you really want to know more why not join us and both hear about it and be part of it. Medan Hash has had a great past and looks forward to an even better future.

THE MEDAN HASH BIB

Medan Hashers wear bibs but why? This question, akin to, 'what is the meaning of life?' has perplexed philosophers world wide for many many a year. Or at least since 1973, which was when Medan H3 began the tradition.

Many theories have been put forward, including Freudian scholars claims that it reflects a hashers preoccupation with breasts, arising from his childhood memories of being breastfed while wearing a BIB. I don't know about childhood memories but there are certainly hashers who are preoccupied with breasts. But then again there are others who are preoccupied by arses and the others who are preoccupied by **nts. So let's leave the Freudians to their sexual predilections and try to get to ore plausible reasons why Medan hashers wear bibs.

Close scrutiny of a bib will perhaps give you some clues as to why they are worn. Firstly and most obviously a hasher's name is clearly embroidered on his bib. This serves two purposes. First it helps the GM use the right name when charging a hasher in the down-down circle. Despite this "aide de memoire" GMs frequently fall foul of the "wrong name" cry, especially when Bintang induced amnesia tends to take charge. The second plus of having a hashers name embroidered on his bib is that it helps bartenders and others who, finding a semi-comatosed hashers lying on the floor of their establishment, then have to find out who he is and where to send him. Ideally, you might suggest a hasher should also have his telephone number on his bib. Then the bartender could just call the hasher's unmentionable (Medan H3 speak for wife/girlfriend/mistress/etc) and tell her to come and collect her little boy. But think again. A telephone number is a valuable piece of information for the washing machines (Medan H3 speak for those unmentionables who are in the etc. category). These unmentionables might think they know who "Breast Stroker" or "Condom Goreng" is but there is no way we are going to give them a piece of info that would allow them to find out the real identities of the bold hasher who has yet to pay for the last wash and spin dry.

On further examination of a bib you will notice a pocket in about the middle of the bib. The smart hashers have discovered that a glass of Bintang is an exact fit for tis pocket. Thus if you look around the down-down circle you will notice about 10% of the hashers are using the pocket for its intended purpose. Do not assume that this means that on

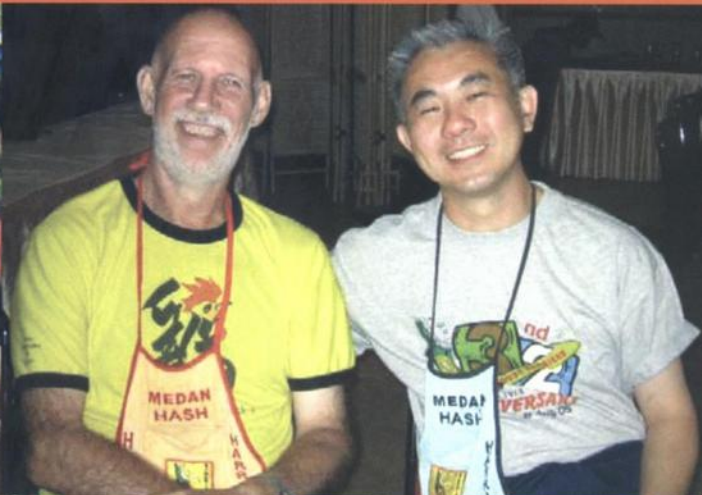

So a bib serves to identify a hasher and help him hold his beer. But what else? Well if you observe the majority of down-downs these days you will note that spillage is a fairly common occurrence. Thus, were it not for the bib a hasher wears this spillage would rapidly soak the front of the hasher's t-shirt, which coupled with the soaking on the back at the executioners hands might rapidly lead to a dose of double pneumonia. Thus the bib is also a medical device similar to a jock strap, in that it prevents an injury or illness. If you don't know what a jock strap is, ask a friendly Scotsman.

Some hashers have been seen to wear their bibs on their heads. It should be noted that this kind of behaviour is to be actively discouraged. Bibs are not hats and anyone using them in this manner will be dealt with severely. Equally you may have noticed that unmentionables have developed bibs with a zipped pocket in front and that they now wear them like a hand bag. Any move in that direction by the "real" hash will likely lead to a mass revolt at worst or a serious "rule 6" charge at best.

So where do we stand on why Medan hashers wear bibs?. I've given you some reasonable and some not so reasonable reasons and now I will give you historical fact. The original purpose of the bib was to help hares know if all the hashers had returned after the run or if there were still hashers who had not and might be lost in the jungle. The process was as follows.. Before hashers started the run they would hang their bibs on the "bib stand" and when they returned they would collect their bibs from the same stand. If there were bibs remaining on the stand then obviously there were still hashers out and a quick check of the bibs revealed how many and who they were.

Unfortunately this excellent tradition did not stand the test of time as firstly bibs were 'borrowed' from the stand by hashers other than their true owners and then to cap it all the "bib stand" was borrowed. Luckily however Medan hash managed to continue the tradition of giving each hasher a bib and ensuring the bibs are worn in the down-down circle. This tradition is to the best of my knowledge a Medan original and the Medan Harriers and Harriettes and the Batavia Hash in Jakarta are the only hashes in the world that wear bibs. So forget your t-shirt, your hash shorts or your sarongs. Any old hash wears this kind of gear. We in Medan are proud to be members of that exclusive group of hashers who wear bibs!

THE HORAS HASH

The original idea for the Horas Hash came from Rudy "Lagger" Lie. Now as Lagger was also one of the founder members of Medan Hash, back in 1973, you would think he ought to have known better. So here he was proposing an annual hash pilgrimage to Lake Toba for three days of doing what hashers do best, running and drinking of course! After a name we needed a hash logo. Again culture served as our inspirational area. The lizard, or gecko, is considered to be a lucky reptile by the Bataks and as we thought we could do with all the luck we could get, the gecko got the logo job. When you visit North Sumatra keep a look out for the gecko on the carvings around the eves of houses, both

With two hash fools now working on the concept it didn't take long for things to start to come together. First we needed a name for the event. As Lake Toba was to be the area where we would be running we needed something associated with the region. Place names didn't seem to fit, and neither did features of the area such as the many volcanoes. So we started to look at cultural aspects. That's when it became really quite simple. Language is one of the central aspects of a people's culture, and the indigenous people of the Lake Toba

inside and outside. You will also see the real thing on walls and ceilings cleaning up the mosquito population - great little fellas!

With a name and a logo we were well on our way, and all there was to do now was organize the event! Some six trips to Berastagi and Samosir Island later and after many hours spent checking trails we had the runs sorted out. The plan was to have a TGIF run in Berastagi, the main run at the Sipisopiso waterfall on the Saturday and finish with a "hair of the dog" run on Samosir Island on the Sunday. A leisurely drive back to Medan on the Monday would allow the die-hards to take in the men's Monday run if they had any energy left.

Oh, I nearly forgot to mention that after the Saturday run there was to be a hash booze cruise down Lake Toba to our hotel. So we also had to do a trial run of this to get the timing right. It took about two and a half hours one way but of course we had to do the round trip - you can drink quite a few beers on a five hour boat trip.



So that was what was planned, but was that what happened? Well read on and see what you think.

THE FIRST HORAS HASH; 20th - 23rd MAY 2005

Although most people arrived in Medan on the Friday morning some stalwarts had arrived the day before and had already got into hashing mode by joining the harriettes Thursday run, and then getting their palates adjusted to Bintang beer with a few down-downs. So there were a few thick heads and weary bodies when the buses made the early morning rounds of the hotels and airport to get the team ready for the trip up the hill to Berastagi.

Berastagi is a small town about 68 kilometres south of Medan laying at the northern edge of the Karo Plateau. The town was originally developed as a hill station by the Dutch and as it is at an elevation of 1330m it is delightfully cool and scenic. A great place for us to kick off the Horas Hash long weekend.

We had gathered together a diverse group of hashers and although the majority was from Medan we had representatives from Malaysia, Vietnam, Australia and Jakarta, to ensure an international flavour that was to prove very useful during the weekend - but more of that later. After lunch in Berastagi we checked into our hotel and hashers being hashers someone prevailed on the Bintang guys to open the first barrel. With around two hours to go the start of the TGIF run this could have had disastrous consequences. As it turned out the beer drinkers were lively and ready to go at the appointed time, which was more than could be said for those who had decided to take a quick nap to get them in shape for the run. They had to be roused from their slumbers, and only made it to the starting line in time because there were so many "new shoes" transgressors to be dealt with. As part of the Lake Toba eco-tourism sports event the Governor of North Sumatra had organized a tree planting ceremony, at which a tree would be planted by a representative of every country in attendance at the sports. So who planted all the trees? Yes you're right. "Cowboy" from Australia, "Beano" from England, "Anzac" from Vietnam, "Bonsai" from Malaysia and so on, and so on. Some of the national affiliations were stretching credibility a little but the hash as usual did their bit for good international relations. Governor Rizal was a great character and a friend of the hash, and it was with great sadness that we learnt of his death in a plane crash some months later.

The "Hare of the Dog" run was to start at 11:00 am on the Sunday morning, and considering the previous night's antics a surprising number of hashers fronted up at start time. The run left the Toledo Inn and headed up the hill immediately behind it, then along the ridge and down into the valley behind. A couple of hills later and the pack could see the imposing near vertical cliffs that rise from the east side of Samosir Island, with a narrow slash of white marking the location of one of the many waterfalls that cascade from the plateau above. This imposing sight was however viewed with trepidation by most, as the trail was heading straight in that direction! Now although we've already established that the hare "Stainless" might be a fool, luckily it turned out that even he wasn't foolish enough to take on the challenge of climbing the cliffs. The trail eventually took a hard right for a pleasant shaded amble parallel to the cliff line, taking in the many small villages along the way, and then it was back along the lakeside road to the hotel and the beer.
